

Rockets advance in region after win over Barbourville

After a terrible 4 and 9 regular season record the Rockcastle County Rocket baseball team has done quite well for themselves as of late.

The Rockets advanced to the regional tournament last week by handling Clay County a 7-2 loss in Manchester and finishing second in the district, after losing to Jackson County 10-1, Thursday afternoon.

But Monday afternoon the Rockets continued their trek toward the state tournament with a thrilling 8-7 victory over Barbourville in Corbin.

The Rockets got off to an early \$0 lead and it looked as if their top flame thrower junior Tim Hodges would easily notch his fifth victory against only 2 losses, but the Rockets would find that it wouldn't be that easy, before the day was out.

Rockcastle lead 6-3 going into the top of the 7th inning when Barbourville jumped on Hodges for 4 runs and the lead at 7-6.

And the Rockets found themselves with nobody on base and two outs in the seventh inning when junior Chris Larkley came to the plate. Larkley ripped a single up the middle to keep the Rockets faint hopes alive. But, then Gary Ahney took Barbourville's pitcher

to the wall for a double that advanced Larkley to third and him to second.

The stage was set for sophomore David Owens, who would either be the hero of the day or the disappointment.

But Monday was Owens' day to shine. He hit a single which knocked in both runs and gave the

Rockets the 8-7 victory and kept them alive in the regional tournament.

They played again Wednesday afternoon after the signal's deadline.

Head Coach David Perkins said Tuesday that the Rockets had a good chance of getting all the way to the state and that their regular season record did not indicate the caliber of team he had.

"The early season weather we had really put us behind," Perkins said. "We are just now coming into our own."

Perkins contributed much of the Rockets success to second baseman Kevin Buswell, who Perkins said "is killing the ball."

Buswell is hitting .518. What will pitch Wednesday? Hodges probably. On one day's rest. "It is crunch time," said assistant Coach David Riddle.
