



The article is as follows:

County Judges, who have remitted or suspended fines, will be held strictly accountable for the State's portion of the fines by State Inspector and Examiner, Nat B. Sewell, who received an opinion to day from Assistant Atstating that while a judge has the right in term to set aside judg-ment and grant a new trial, be has es. It is customary in many counties for the County Judge af counties for the County Judge at res restreece to remit: the fiftee or suspend it, or to go to the juli-and direct the release of a prisoner serving out a fine. This has been held to be a direct excretes of the perdoning power, which belongs alose to the Governer. County islates, the opinion says, have, no right to release a prisoner on such torns. The opinion-quotes the Court of Appeals, siying: "The practice of suspending the judgments of courts in misdementor cases as a failular to enforce the law it encourage circum and is a
