October 22 said the company's current business is to rent uniforms but its management wants to get into the manufacture of uniforms as well. The proposed factory in Mt. Vernon would employ about 250, he said.

Potential employees should have at least an eighth grade education. Among the jobs available would be factory power sewing, service, cutting, shipping.


