



Local students score well on CATS

Rockcastle County school students performed extremely well on the state's new test, the Commonwealth Accountability Testing System or CATS.

Results from those tests given students last school year were released last week by the local school system.

According to Mrs. Claudinna Pensol, Stratton placed back on library board

Last week Rockcastle County Judge-Executive Buzz Carlotis and the Rockcastle Fiscal Court re-appointed Allen Pensol and Serena Stratton to the Rockcastle County library board.

Carlotis said that he had delayed their appointments because of a problem in placing a CenterNet Facility at the library.

Carlotis said earlier this year that he thought that the Center should be located at the library because of the educational opportunities it will provide.

However, the library board declined to accept the Center. It will now be located in a remodeled courtroom at the local courthouse.

Besides Pensol and Stratton, Sue Hamm, Corey Craig and Jerry Burke comprise the local board. Pensol is chairman.

Livingston High reunion Oct. 30

Livingston High School will hold its annual Homecoming Reunion at the Charcoal House at Days Inn, 1-75 and Highway 192, London on Saturday, October 30, 1999.

Cash, the local school system's assessment coordinator, when Rockcastle's scores were compared to those in Rockcastle's region and to those in the state, local students scored extremely well.

The CATS test was given to fourth, fifth, seventh, eighth, tenth, eleventh and twelfth grade students.

Students were tested in reading, math, science, social studies/arts and humanities, practical living and writing.

As a whole, the county's fourth and fifth graders scored a total academic index of 69.0 compared to an average of 63.0 in the district and 59.5 in the state.

Rockcastle's region is comprised of the counties of Clinton, Wayne, McCreary, Whitley, Bell, Harlan, Lincoln, Knox, Casey, Taylor, Adair, Garrard, Madison, Pulaski, Eschil, Laurel, Clay and Jackson Counties.

Seventh and eighth graders scored a total of 57.3 compared to the region's 46.9 and the state's 49.6.

RCHS students scored 61.2 compared to the region's 56.5 and the state's 60.3.

The best scores of the local grade schools were at Brodhead where the total academic index was 77.6. Roundstone students scored 71.5 and Mt. Vernon Elementary students scored 63.4.

At all three elementary schools the best scores were recorded in reading and the poorest scores were in arts and humanities.

At the middle school students there also scored best in reading, but the lowest scores were in practical living.

At RCHS the best scores were in social studies and the poorest were in practical living.

Mrs. Cash said that the state would take the results from the CATS test and the Comprehensive Test of Basic Skills given to students each year and come up with a new baseline score for each school.

Tuesday last day you can apply for absentee ballots

Construction of new school at Brodhead begins in June

About 25 interested persons turned out Tuesday night to discuss the construction of a new Brodhead Elementary School building.

The construction committee for the new building fielded questions from the audience concerning the project, which is slated to begin this summer.

Members of the committee are Brodhead Principal Mark McKinney, P.T.A. President Kristi Reynolds, teachers Patsy Alcorn and Kathy Dyhouse, community parent member Johnny Boone Saylor, board member Terry Burton, Superintendent Larry Hammond and central office staff, Richard Bray, Shelby Reynolds and Glen Vanwinkle and architect David Samoker.

Richard Bray said that Samoker, McKinney and other Brodhead staff

people would meet in about two weeks to begin preliminary work on plans for the new building.

Bray said that building would be built to accommodate 500 students. Brodhead currently has an enrollment of 450.

Current plans are for the construction of the new school to be on the playground at the school with the old structure being torn down for the new playground and parking. Bray said that construction should start in June and take about 14 months to complete.

More than likely, depending on the wishes of the staff at the school, the new building will be a single story structure," Bray said.

The estimated cost of the project will be roughly \$6 million and should be complete by the beginning of school in August of 2001.

Coroner rules electrocution in Eric Ponder death

Madison County Coroner Jimmy Cornelison has ruled the death of a local man as electrocution.

Eric D. Ponder, 37, of Brindle Ridge, a well known electrician, died last Tuesday, while working on a photo sensor at a Richmond factory.

Cornelison said that Ponder came into contact with 270 volts of electricity, which caused his death, be-

fore falling some 25 feet off the building.

Cornelison said that a state medical examiner, who performed the autopsy, found that Ponder was killed by the electricity and not the fall.

Funeral services were held for Ponder on Saturday. He was buried in the Red Hill Cemetery.

Judge Venters moves murder trial to Lincoln

Circuit Judge Dan Venters has granted a change of venue in a local case that has been kicked around in Circuit Court since May of 1993.

Earl Kirby, 42, of Mt. Vernon went on trial in August for the 1993 shooting death of his uncle Lester Franks Griffin, 49.


But, after two days of trying to seat a jury, Venters declared a mistrial because, according to his order, "so many jurors indicated that they

had detailed knowledge of the allegations in the case, had formed opinions about material issues, and could not render a fair trial."


Venters ruled that the case be moved to Lincoln Circuit Court and be placed on the docket for December 10.

Last year the 1993 murder indictment against Kirby was dismissed, but he was indicted a short time later by another grand jury

Sweet and Sour

Beansoup and Cornbread

When one meets a fellow Kentuckian, especially those from the part of Kentucky that lies in the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains, the conversation soon turns to kin-folks and food. And usually the first thing is, "Boy, how I would like to sit down to Mom's table with a big bowl of soups and cornbread or fried breakfast of ham, gravy and biscuits. Chicken and dumplings are the next choice.

Once the soil from the hills of Kentucky dirties a baby's feet he or she never sheds it and it leads them back "Home" every chance they get. They are also the only people I have ever met, regardless of what state they were born in, that calls their place of birth home even though they have lived elsewhere for years. Sometimes the memories of those years and the food nourished them to man or womanhood is always uppermost in their mind, and of course no one could possibly prepare it the way Mom did. If one talks long enough to them they will hear all about the berries or apple pies she made and how the kids did the picking of them. The berry fields were often in the far corner of the farm and one had to leave early in the morning to get the berries-picked before a hot fog and so the cobblers would have time to bake before the noon meal. This was a dreaded chore or an outing by several children vying to see who could fill their buckets first. By mid morning the lone picker or the family gang would be back with full buckets. Disheveled clothes, scratched hands and smudged cheeks were the next in which would keep them busy scratching for the next several hours.

There is always hard work associated with these goodies we all like to talk about and sometimes that is a big part of the conversation. First one will tell of all the times he had to cut the wood for the stove to cook breakfast, or bring up the water for wash day. Then another will chime in with "but I had to do the dishes and help with the washing. A third will be quick to say, "Do you remember when Mom had the last baby and we all had to join in doing the work and I didn't know how to bake biscuits or gravy and was laughed at. It didn't take me long after that to learn and now I can match my skill with the best of them."

Breakfast would be started with a hunk of the cook stove, meat sliced from a big ham hanging in the smoke house, placed in an iron skillet and put on the back of the stove to begin frying while biscuits were being made from scratch. To do this one had to have a big bowl of flour, baking powder, salt, lard (for shortening), and milk. After carefully mixing and kneading it in the bowl it would be dumped onto the biscuit board and kneaded more, then cut with a biscuit cutter and placed in a big bread pan and put in the hot oven. By now the ham was ready to turn for its final browning and the coffee scooted to a place to keep warm while the biscuits were ready to take out the ham would be removed from the skillet and gravy made in the drippings. If apples hadn't been fried there would be a big jar of apple butter and a bowl of freshly churned butter to complement the biscuits, ham and gravy. Yep, that was a breakfast worth remembering.

We always called the noon day dinner, for that was the big meal of the day. The men had been work-

ing since day break and needed it and leftovers would do for supper. That was the time for soup beans and cornbread, fried potatoes and cooked cabbage, home cured meat or a fat hen with dumplings. All of which were home grown. There was no running to the store for something to eat if company dropped by, but sometimes we may have to cook the ham-bone with a pot of cabbage or potatoes to give flavor to the meal. When I cooked cabbage and a ham bone I always thought of my Mom and the way she cooked it. She would quarter the cabbage into a big pot of water, drop in the bone with plenty of meat left on, drop in a big pod of hot pepper, ever it, cook till tender and it was as good with cornbread as soups were. Mat was allergic to pepper so I had to leave the pepper out when I cooked them.

Biscuits and/or cornbread was served at every meal. Cornbread was easy to make, in fact so easy any one of my kids could bake a pan of cornbread by the time they were eight or nine years old as good as any professional cook. Maybe even better, for we were cranky about the texture, and thickness. We didn't like it thick and crumbly. We wanted it soft and golden brown on top and bottom. That was the way they were taught and that was the way they baked it.

I wonder how many of you know, or have ever wondered, where corn meal comes from? In case you don't let me refresh your memory, that is if you were raised on a farm or the foothills of Appalachia. In the first place you must raise the right kind of corn. We always preferred white, it was raised in a section of the field where it could not mix with other kinds and was carefully tended so it would reach maturity without blemishes. At harvest it was kept separate from the rest of the harvest and protected from contamination. After it had cured till the kernels were hard the shucks would be removed and the kernels shelled from the cobby hand. First the tip end would be broken or cut off and one row would be carefully removed. Then a thumb or palm of the hand would quickly remove the rest by forcing them into the empty space. Later a corn sheller was used and this saved many a blister on tender hands. The corn was then poured into a sack kept for that purpose. It was a large heavy dust proof sack with a yarning string attached to the top and usually held about a bushel of corn. Then it was loaded onto the back of a mule, if one was available, or truck, if one was owned and taken to the grist mill to be ground into meal. A grist mill was often used by several communities so it might take the most of a day to get the meal ground and back home. But some ground meal was much superior to what we buy in the store and was worth all the effort. The owner of the mill took a portion of the meal as his fee. Then he would fill the surplus. Mush, made from freshly ground corn, and cold milk from the spring makes the best evening meal one could ever want. And cornbread made from it can't be beaten.

Soup beans and cornbread have been the diet of mountain folks so long it has become one of the most popular dishes in all of the surrounding states. When our hills and valleys were emptied of native inhabitants seeking a living wage elsewhere they took their recipes and habits along and soon their associates joined them in enjoying a big bowl of hot bean soup with cornbread crumbled into it.

Sort a pound or so of pinto, or great northern beans, or a mixture of them, carefully washed to remove debris from the harvesting fields, put into a large kettle with plenty of water, salt, a chunk of jowl meat, or ham bone, let come to a boil then cook slowly (approximately three hours) or until the beans are soft and the soup creamy thick. Serve with hot cornbread, baked or fried and a big dish of sliced onions. This had become popular and is in demand in many restaurants.





Local students help break Transy enrollment record

Transylvania University's full-time enrollment is up this fall from 1,660 to 1,664, making this the largest full-time enrollment in Transylvania's 219-year history. Total enrollment - including part-time students - is 1,873.

"While full-time enrollment is up, Transylvania's entering class of 508 is the smallest by design since 1995," said President Charles L. Shearer. "Transylvania had enrolled around 345 freshmen the past three years but limited new student enrollment this year."

There are four students from Rockcastle County attending Transylvania University: Jessica Albright, Joshua Cory Bailey, Suzanne Brown and Bethanie Hammond.

"Interest in Transylvania among academically talented students continues to increase, but we don't want our overall enrollment to grow be-

yond our capacity. We want to maintain our commitment to small classes and personal attention," said Shearer.

Shearer said he is extremely pleased with the academic quality of the freshman class. "The quality of this class is outstanding in every measure of academic strength." The average ACT and SAT scores are well above the national averages, the average high school GPA is 3.5, 50 percent graduated in the top 10 percent of their class, 16 are National Merit Finalists and 30 were valedictorians.

Transylvania is consistently ranked in national publications as one of the top liberal arts colleges in the country, including *U.S. News & World Report*, *The National Review College Guide*, *America's 50 Top Liberal Arts Schools*, *Peterson's Top Colleges for Science* and the *Smart Parents Guide to College*.







Panthers no competition in district contest Rockets score 55 in first half to win seventh game

The Rockcastle County Rockets scored 34 points in the first quarter and 55 in the first half on their way to a 55-0 win over visiting Knox Central Friday night.

It was the Rockets seventh win of the season against only one loss. The win also extended the Rockets undefeated mark in district play to 3 and 0.

The Panthers were absolutely no match for the Rockets as they rolled up 481 yards of total offense against the winless Panthers.

Head coach Tom Larkey said Tuesday that he was pleased with his team's effort against a lesser opponent.

"Sometimes when you have a game against a team that hasn't won all season your players have a let down, but we didn't overlook Central," he said.

"Last week's game against Whitley made it even tougher because our kids were sky high against the Colonels and they played extremely well down there - but I think we showed a lot of maturity by the way we came out ready to play Friday night," he said.

Larkey gave his offensive line a lot of credit for Friday night's domination of the Panthers.

"Center Brad McNew, guards Sean Smith and Chris Kirby and tackles Jason Bullock and Matt Smith, along with ends, Greg Harper made some very big holes for our backs to run through and they gave our quarterback time to throw," Larkey said.

"The line has really come together as a unit the last three or four games and it has showed up in the way we have been able to move the ball up and down the field," he said.

Friday night the Rockets scored on runs of 30, 4, 13, 19 and 18. They scored on pass plays of 47, 44 and 39.

Placekicker Greg Terry was seven for eight in extra point attempts. Junior tailback Derrick Buscell carried the ball only twice on Friday night, but he made the most of his runs picking up a total of 43 yards and scoring touchdowns on both runs.

Senior fullback Josh Dooley had his best offensive game of the season, picking up 129 yards on 13 carries.

Freshman Marty Reagan rushed five times for 51 yards and two touchdowns.

Senior Derek Bradley had 16 yards on three carries, sophomore Clay Dooley gained 46 yards on eight carries and freshman Mark Miller had 24 yards on five carries.

Junior Heath Payne and fresh-

man J. T. Lovell each carried the ball once for a yard.

Starting quarterback Christopher Parsons was six for eight for 142 yards and three touchdowns. He also rushed for one score on 19 yard gain.

Sophomore Josh Hale caught three passes, one for 39 yards and a touchdown.

Junior Greg Harper caught two passes, both for scores. He scored on plays of 47 and 44 yards for a total of 91 yards.

Junior Dackery Larkey caught one pass for 10 yards and senior Kevin Childress caught one pass for three yards.

Freshman quarterback Aaron Anderkin was one for three for ten yards.

The Rock defense held Knox Central to a total of 92 yards of which mostly were gained on the Rocket junior varsity and freshmen players.

Junior middle linebacker Travis Ingram had 9 tackles and a sack, before being rested most of the second half.

Senior defensive lineman Joel Deatherage had 6 tackles and assists, two fumble recoveries and four sacks, before he was rested.

Domestic violence: abusers and victims

The Rockcastle Domestic Violence Council is pleased to present the third article in a series of four acknowledging October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month. This article was written from a counselor's perspective and discusses characteristics of abusers, reasons women stay and how counseling works with domestic violence.

Batters and abusing men come from all social, racial and cultural levels. They share many, if not all of the following characteristics.

1. Inability to handle stress without outbursts of violent behavior.
2. Negative attitudes toward women - thinks women are inferior; has rigid stereotypes about "a woman's place."
3. Was likely abused or dominated by his own father.
4. Blames others for his misfortunes, mistakes or failures.
5. Abuses drugs and/or alcohol. Refuses to admit he has a problem with it; becomes violent or irrational and blames his victim.
6. Isolates his wife or girlfriend from the support of friends and family. May refuse to let her work, or cause her to lose her job.
7. Irrationally jealous and possessive. Accuses her of being with other men or wanting to be with other men.

8. Very controlling - wants to control her telephone calls, money, job, shopping, friends, etc.
9. Requires perfection from wife and children, such as perfect meals, perfect housekeeping, staying out of his way, keeping quiet, etc.
10. Believes a man has the right to physically punish his wife and children. Tells them it's their fault and believes it's the only way to "teach them a lesson."

Abusers are often manipulative and can display a charming side to those outside the family. Most of them refuse to admit they have a problem and think their behavior is normal. Often the women in their families enable them to continue abusive behavior by accepting it as normal.

Women from all classes, races and cultural backgrounds become the victims of abuse. While there is no particular profile of the battered woman, many who stay in abusive relationships came from homes where violence was prevalent. When they stay in that environment long enough, they begin to have low opinions of themselves, and to make excuses for their abusive spouses and boyfriends.

- Some of the reasons women stay with abusive men include:
1. Fear of poverty.
 2. Fear of being alone.
 3. Fear of retribution from abuser, i.e. "I'll kill you if you ever leave me" or "I'll take the children and you'll never see them again" or "I'll hurt your parents."
 4. Fear of breaking up a family.
 5. Fear of rejection from religious group or social group because of divorce.
 6. Fear of not being believed or supported by law enforcement, courts, social service agencies, family or friends.

Doesn't know she deserves better treatment.
When a woman in an abusive relationship enters therapy, she is not told what to do. Rather, she is educated about the difference between normal and abusive relationships. She learns of the effect of domestic violence on children. She is taught to be assertive, but not provocative. She learns ways to enhance her self-esteem and self-respect. She learns that she has options and is taught safety measures. After going through the counseling process, a woman is less likely to make choices that will lead her toward domestic violence.

Next week's article will describe the criminal court process from an attorney's perspective. If you or someone you know is in an abusive

son review board appointed by the corporation president will provide a hearing to the parties in dispute and then issue an unappealable final decision.

Applicants who missed the deadline must submit a Disputed/Amended application form, with a valid reason for the application being late. Late applications face the possibility of having their payment from the trust significantly delayed.

The period during which disputed applications will be accepted is tentatively scheduled for November 2nd through November 12th. Applications submitted after November 12, 1999 will not be considered for payment from the National Tobacco Growers Settlement Trust in 1999 McKinney said.

Fire hazard continues

Relief from recent rainfall has been short-lived in Kentucky. In fact, the commonwealth is still experiencing an extreme drought. Consequently, officials with the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources and the Kentucky Division of Forestry continue to caution all hunters and other outdoor enthusiasts to take

special care while afield. Extremely dry conditions caused by drought have made the grass and woodlands very dry and fire can be ignited easily. "Extra precaution should be taken with any type of heat source," cautions Fire Management Chief Bernie Anderson with the Kentucky Division of Forestry. "The

drought has produced extremely dry conditions, making the state's fields and woods very susceptible to fires." Everyone involved in outdoor activities needs to be especially careful with potential fire ignition sources, including cigarettes, matches and vehicles in the field. A fire can be started by a vehicle's hot catalytic converter or tail pipe when the vehicle has been parked on dry grass. Between July 1 and October 5, 1999, the Division of Forestry suppressed 592 fires that burned 14,730 acres. Outdoor burning bans are still in effect in 112 counties. The bans are

issued by the county judge/executive and will remain in place at the discretion of each county. KDFWR law enforcement officers are enforcing all bans on open burning and other emergency measures designed to minimize the threat of brushland forest fires.

According to Diana Olszowy, Environmental Control Branch Manager with the Division of Forestry, counties that have lifted the burning bans have experienced an increase in fires. The increased winds and low moisture content of forest fuel, such

as grass, leaves, etc., are causing the fires to burn hotter and move very rapidly.

Everyone is reminded to be very careful. Please do not throw cigarettes

butts, matches, charcoal or other flaming items on the ground. It only takes a spark to destroy acres of grass and woodlands.





"WHAT SAITH THE SCRIPURES"
