Accidental poisonings are one of the most common causes of serious illnesses in early childhood. Children who are one to four years old are very inquisitive and love to explore any drawes and doors they can get open.

Many bottles and boxes of cleaters, medicines and other substances are kept under sinks, in drawers-and the substances on their clothes and floor than in their mouths. A print cannot know, for sure.

For much ingestion, the best treatment is to induce vointing if it can be done very soon after the ingestion.

To be most effective, incess needs, to be given within an hour of the ingestion. On any doctors advise parents to have a bottle at hope in case of such an emergency. Be sure to check with your doctor of the price of the pieces because an increasing number of secidental poisonings are treated with activated charcoal and laxatives, or just close observation.

Most abnormalities can be re-moved in a simple, in-office proce-dure that usually requires no anesthe-sia: This-horoma-parts are destroyed or removed 'either by freezing (cryosurgery), burning (cauteriza-tion), using a laser (laser therapy), using an electric wire (electrosur-gery). If abnormal cells get into the canal of the cervix, a surgical proce-dure in which a come-shaped piece of tissue is removed from the tenter

of the cervix may be recommended. If invasive cancer is present, surject removal of the uterus, called a hysterectority, may be necessary. Cervical cancer is one of the miost preventable of all cancers because Pap tests can destect cell changes long before they progress to cancer and the colposcopy can help determine how severe the changes are. If your health provider recommends colposcopy, don't put in off for months. Go shead and schedule it. Most of the time everything is fine. But if it isn't, you don't want to delay treatment any longer than necessary.


